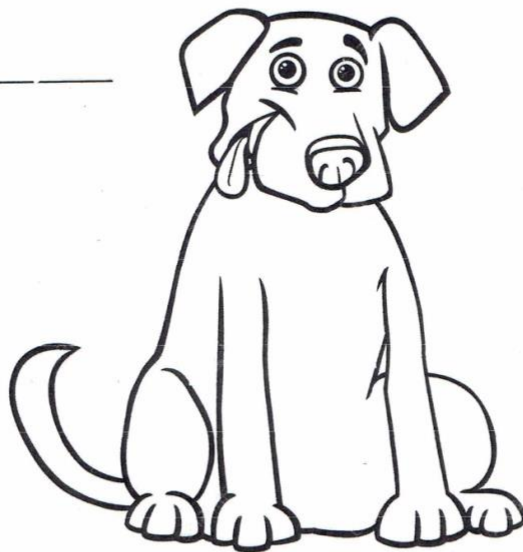
Activity 3: Rover Rhythm
